According to the Institute of Medicine (IOM), 80% of registered nurses in the United States will need to hold a bachelor's degree or higher by the year 2020 in order to meet national demand. In order to adjust to the changing needs of the patient population, the IOM report suggests that all nurses will be required to achieve higher levels of education and practice to the full extent of their training.

The College Network

The College Network's online program enables you to continue your education and earn college credit from the comfort of home. Satisfy your general education and elective requirements using The College Network's online program and exams while completing nursing courses at Regis University.

Most of your general education and elective requirements may be fulfilled using The College Network's online program and exams. In some situations, you may be required to take a DSST®, Excelsior College®, or CLEP® exam for certain courses.

Practicum Experiences

Regis University acknowledges that registered nurses are highly experienced health care professionals who bring valuable skills and abilities to their current academic pursuits. Therefore, a course with a clinical component, called a practicum, is designed specifically for registered nurses. The practicum course students will complete in the program is in community health nursing. The practicum is preceded by a related theory course and requires 45 hours "in the field" at a local agency that can provide meaningful learning experiences for the student in the course content area.

The community health practicum hours are completed in an agency that provides population-based nursing. The major assignment for this course is the completion of a community assessment and program plan.

In addition to the practicum component of the program, you are required to complete 20 hours of service learning. Service learning provides an educational experience while instilling the belief that service to one's community is a lifelong pursuit. Service learning is integrated into your program of study as part of the BSN program. The nursing faculty and service learning coordinator help you to establish an appropriate service learning project.

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Degree Track Options for Courses in the Nursing Major

Option 1:

Fast-Track Progression

The Fast Track progression allows the student to complete the program in 12 months over 3 semesters in 8-week terms.

Start: January, May, or August

Option 2:

Standard Progression

Standard progression allows the student to complete the program over 24 months.

Start: January, May, or August

Course Descriptions

NR 444R Professional Role Development (3 SH)

Examines themes including the Jesuit mission, service learning, personal and professional values, roles and issues in contemporary professional nursing, standards of practice, and academic tools that foster success in the nursing program.

NR 448R Updates in Illness and Disease Management (3 SH)

Focuses on pathophysiology and updates in medical management and nursing care of selected acute and chronic illnesses. Social, cultural, and environmental influences on health and illness are explored. Features current research and the use of cutting-edge and web-based health care resources.

NR 452R Contemporary Topics in Health Care (3 SH)

Explores professional nursing roles within contemporary health care topic areas, including informatics, human diversity and cultural competence, gerontology, vulnerable populations, violence, social justice, and global health. Students engage in service learning and reflection.

NR 455R Health Promotion Concepts (3 SH)

Focuses on health promotion and health teaching for healthy lifestyles in a diverse and multicultural society. Concepts of culture, spirituality, aging, chronicity, advocacy, and client anatomy are explored. The nursing process is applied to health promotion, disease prevention, and wellness through health teaching interventions.

NR 460R Evidence-Based Practice in Nursing (3 SH)

Focuses on analysis and research by the professional nurse. Analyzes research processes and other tools fundamental to evidence-based nursing practice and stresses the importance of both qualitative and quantitative methods to the evolving art and science of nursing. Prerequisite: NR 444R.

NR 466R Community Health Nursing (3 SH)

Provides overview on population-based nursing. Explores principles relevant to community health nursing including public health, epidemiology, and environmental health. Addresses the impact of health care policies on social justice and health care disparities.

NR 478R Community Health Nursing Practicum (3 SH)

Fosters integration of community health theory into clinical practice while students complete 45 hours of practicum in a community-based setting. With faculty guidance, students select experiences that provide the opportunity to develop a community assessment and program plan. Service learning activities focus on community and social justice.

NR 480R The Nurse Leader-Manager (3 SH)

Expands knowledge of leadership and management principles applied to health care, the changing health care system, health outcomes, professional issues, political action, and career development. Explores ethical, legal, and policy issues related to nursing practice.

NR 485R Leadership in Nursing Capstone (3 SH)

This leadership capstone course is designed to provide the students opportunities to integrate leadership and management principles into professional practice as they reflect on RN-BSN Completion Program learning. Includes faculty-directed assignments and projects as indirect practice activities to achieve course and program outcomes.

HCE 430R Applied Ethics in Health Care (3 SH)

Examines ethical dilemmas in health care and the decision-making process involved in clinical, professional, and organizational ethics. Explores philosophical and faith-based foundations, including Catholic moral tradition, sociocultural influences, professional codes, and organizational and personal ethical norms.

Admissions Criteria

- Be presently licensed as a registered nurse and be in good standing with the board of nursing in the state in which you will complete your practicum.
- Have a grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale. (Note: Prospective students with lower GPAs will be considered on an individual basis by the Department of Nursing.)
- Fill out transcript request forms (provided by The College Network).
 The College Network will send for your transcripts from all colleges and universities attended and will forward them to Regis University.

- 4. Submit two completed recommendation forms. One professional recommendation is required from a current supervisor; the second can be either academic or professional.
- Online RN to BSN students must meet basic hardware and software requirements and have some experience using the Internet.

DNP Program for MS in Nursing Graduates

The Doctor of Nursing Practice is the terminal practice degree for nurses who choose to maintain focus on providing leadership in nursing practice. Graduates of the BS in Nursing program have an opportunity to further their education and earn their MS in Nursing and then continue on and earn their DNP online through Regis University.
